STAGE 1 – DO YOU UNDERSTAND THE PRINCIPLES BEHIND THE CASE STUDY?

1. Do you recognise that the case study is your opportunity to apply the knowledge learned through your studies of the three subjects at each level to a modelled business scenario?	YES	NO
2. Do you see the case study as an opportunity to showcase your competence and prove to CIMA you've got what it takes to progress to the next stage of your qualification and your career?	YES	NO

Tip – although there is no requirement to research real companies and no set marks for “research” in the exam, understanding the business, its markets, competitors, opportunities and threats will enhance your ability to show application of your knowledge to a business scenario in the exam and thereby improve the depth and quality of your answers. It will also make you feel more confident.

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| 4. Have you generated potential questions based on the pre-seen and thought about all the different angles the examiner might use to ask questions? | YES | NO |
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Tip – don’t try to guess what might come up in the exam because with 5 variants, it could be anything. But do spend time thinking about what could be asked, think of all the different twists and turns the scenario could take, currency going up or down, a new CEO joining or the old one stepping down, a flotation, fraud, natural disaster, new competitors etc.

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| 5. Have you been on CIMAAconnect and discussed the pre-seen with your fellow students and found out about the Ask a Tutor session for your exam? | YES | NO |
